



As American National Bank & Trust celebrates its 50th anniversary in 2026, our expansion across the greater Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex pairs a unified design language with a deep respect for local character. Partnering with the design-build expertise of Muckleroy & Falls, a company whose purpose aligns with the bank's strategy in expanding our footprint to meet the needs of our growing communities and creating environments where transformational growth can take place, premium blueprints were designed with tailored interiors that mirror the spirit of each community and neighborhood. Since 1976, we have engineered each of our locations to serve as long-term community anchor points, and in 2025 we opened our two newest branches that mark the next chapter in our legacy.

The overarching design intent for both locations was to create a refined, hospitality-driven experience that redefines the traditional perception of banking. Brought to life by Muckleroy & Falls and their design teams, the core brand experience remains instantly recognizable across both the new Dallas and Roanoke locations, while bringing intentional design components unique to each location to distinguish the exterior and interior elements. Open-concept layouts eliminate traditional barriers, seamlessly integrating modern banking technologies while preserving the face-to-face relationship building that defines American National Bank & Trust's fifty-year history.

5310 Forest Lane — Dallas, TX 75244

This ground-up, two-story, 15,000-square-foot custom banking facility makes a bold architectural statement within one of Dallas' active mixed-use commercial corridors. Positioned for visibility and impact, the sleek contemporary design uses clean lines, strong architectural forms, high-end finishes, and refined regional influences to create a warm yet dramatic space that is both highly visible from the highway and deeply connected to the institution's identity — with subtle references to its West Texas roots.

- **The Architecture:** The design intent for this banking environment was to create a refined, hospitality-driven experience that redefines the traditional perception of banking. Inspired by modern architecture with subtle midcentury influences, the

space was designed to feel sophisticated, welcoming, and curated — more reminiscent of a boutique hotel than a conventional bank.

- **The Atmosphere:** Inside, a mix of iconic Dallas photography, upscale artwork, rich materials, and carefully curated interior details create an elevated aesthetic tailored to families, urban professionals, small businesses, and large commercial clientele. Clean contemporary lines are paired with rich wood tones and warm materials to create a sense of comfort, trust, and understated luxury. Wood feature walls, custom millwork, and integrated furnishings provide continuity throughout the space while reinforcing the upscale character of the brand. A layered lighting approach combines soft ambient fixtures with architectural lighting to create depth, warmth, and a relaxed customer experience. The layout balances open customer engagement areas with private consultation spaces to support both hospitality and functionality. Furnishings and finishes were selected to enhance the elevated atmosphere through warm neutrals, natural textures, and refined detailing. Dedicated coffee and lounge areas encourage casual interaction and provide comfortable spaces for informal meetings and entertainment. The outdoor patio area further extends the experience, offering an inviting gathering space that blends professionalism with comfort in a relaxed setting. The ground-floor Mortgage and Retail banking environment and second-floor Commercial Lending and Trust & Wealth Management suites were designed to enhance the client experience and reinforce the institution's commitment to personal relationships and responsive service.
- **The Impact:** More than a branch, this facility serves as a catalyst for economic activity — driving small business growth and providing regional business-to-business networking spaces that support the broader commercial climate of the greater Dallas region.

409 S. Oak St. — Roanoke, TX 76262

Situated in the heart of Roanoke's historic town center, this branch sits at the intersection of the community's storied past and its rapid new growth — surrounded by a dynamic mix of urban living and emerging commercial development. The design embraces this duality, creating a space that is simultaneously rooted in place and oriented toward the future.

- **The Architecture:** Situated directly in the historic town square and across from Roanoke City Hall, the branch was carefully designed to be distinctive yet not overpowering. The exterior establishes a confident civic presence while remaining in

respectful dialogue with the surrounding historic fabric. The building needed to be both traditional and modern, therefore choosing brick to create an urban building that matched adjacent downtown buildings was paramount.

- **The Atmosphere:** Enlarged balconies were designed for client entertainment and meetings, with multi-functionality purposes to host special groups during downtown civic events. The interior transitions into a refined, hospitality-driven environment where warm wood tones, custom millwork, and localized art honor Roanoke's unique history and American West influence. Dedicated coffee and lounge areas encourage casual interaction while offering an inviting gathering space that blends professionalism with comfort in a relaxed, welcoming setting.
- **The Impact:** Positioned at the nexus of Roanoke's historic character and its accelerating growth, this branch reinforces the institution's role as a trusted community partner — a place where neighbors gather, businesses are built, and relationships endure.
